Mission

Programmatic Scope

- Alzheimer's disease,
- Mental Health
- HIV/AIDS
- COVID-19.



How the NCHI Works: Desert Administrative Guidelines

 Each Deputy of (for) the Desert is recommended to register their Desert on the NCHI Website and ensure that the contact information on the website is always accurate and up to date.

Desert NCHI Coordinator:

- The Deputy of (for) the Desert is REQUIRED to appoint a Desert NCHI
 Coordinator and inform the Deputy Imperial Potentate and the Chairman
 of the NCHI Committee of the appointment by December 31st of each year.
- The Desert NCHI Coordinator is required to implement and oversee the Desert's NCHI activities within the Desert and ensure Temples and Courts comply. The Desert NCHI Coordinator will also serve as a liaison between the Imperial NCHI Committee and Temples and Courts within their respective Deserts.



How the NCHI Works: Desert Administrative Guidelines

- The Desert NCHI Coordinator is the sole administrator of the Desert's NCHI activities which include fundraising for the Desert, organizing the Desert NCHI walk activities (if appropriate) and is responsible for the implementation and management of the same.
- The Desert NCHI Coordinator is also responsible for organizing and implementing additional programs or projects as requested by the NCHI Committee, for various special events or occasions.



How the NCHI Works: Temple/Court Administrative Guidelines

- Each Illustrious Potentate/Commandress is *REQUIRED* to appoint a Temple or Court NCHI Representative and inform both the Deputy of (for) the Oasis and the Deputy of (for) the Desert of the appointment by *December 31st* of each year.
- The Temple or Court NCHI Representative is the sole administrator of, and responsible for all Temple or Court NCHI activities which include fundraising, organizing and implementing the annual NCHI walk and related activities.
- Each Temple or Court NCHI Representative is required to attend the training that is hosted during the Imperial Session each year by the NCHI Committee.
- The Temple or Court Representative is responsible for contacting his/her local ADA Chapter to create a working relationship. Additionally, the representatives are encouraged to establish relationships with local health organizations such as the American Heart Association, American Cancer Association, Alzheimer's Association, etc.



How the NCHI Works: Temple/Court Administrative Guidelines

 Each Temple or Court NCHI Representative is required to host a joint NCHI Walk/Run annually before the first Sunday in June which is National Jubilee Day observance.

 The Temple or Court NCHI Representative is also responsible for organizing and implementing additional programs or projects as requested by the Desert NCHI Coordinator, for various special events or occasions.
